ANNOUNCES ONLINE CLAIMS
APPLICATIONS AND INCREASE IN
AMOUNT PER HOME LOAN**

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) now accepts online applications from veterans, survivors and other claimants filing initial applications for disability compensation, pension, education, and vocational rehabilitation and employment benefits without the additional requirement to submit a signed paper copy of the application. VA will now process applications received through its online application website (VONAPP) without the claimant's signature at <http://www.va.gov/onlineapps.htm>.

The Department of Veterans Affairs has raised the ceiling for veterans on its no-down payment home loans to as much as \$729,000. VA home loans are available for veterans to purchase or construct single-family homes, and to purchase condominiums or cooperative apartments.

CONGRESSMAN WALLY HERGER HONORS SOME OF POST 77'S WAR HEROES

Congressman Wally Herger, who represents part of Woodland and other areas of Yolo County, came to the Post 77 Hall on August 13th to present Congressional Certificates of Honor to members of Yolo Post 77. The honors went to Carl Desendorf and Ed Hiatt, both of Woodland. Carl fought with Patton's Army as it went through Europe, including being wounded in action. Sgt. Desendorf's unit was often at the point of General Patton's advance, as they were on VE-Day, where they had driven the furthest east in the European conflict, meeting the Russian Army in Austria. Carl spoke to those in attendance at the awards presentation about some of his many harrowing experiences.

Ed Hiatt was a B-29 pilot, including on 35 bombing missions over Japan, missions which averaged 15 hours each. Ed received the Distinguished Flying Cross, seven Air Medals with six Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal with four Battle Stars.

Congressional certificates were also awarded to Navy Seal Neil Roberts, who died in battle on March 5, 2002 and Marine Staff Sgt. Jimmy Arroyave, who served over 10 years in the Marines upon his death in Iraq on April 15, 2004.

1936 APPLIANCE SHOW

It's hard to imagine the huge size of the original Legion Hall which was the original Armory. It had the flexibility of holding auto shows with 16 full-size automobiles. There were USO dances, basketball games and roller skating. The Hall even had second balcony seating. In the back of the Hall, there was a full kitchen and "home cooked" meals could be prepared and served fresh and hot. Around 6:00 p.m., the aroma of fresh brewed coffee filled both Bush Street and the alley that ran beside and behind the hall. Life was good.



1941 SCRAP METAL DRIVE

Kids line up at the Porter Theatre on College St., Woodland, stretching south to Main St. This was a typical scrap metal drive in Yolo County, with the gentleman in the suit giving out a free ticket to the Saturday matinee in exchange for a sack of scrap. This was one of the first recycling programs, though in this case it was to build a plane, gun, or tank to win WW II. The Homefront also did its part through rationing of coffee, sugar, butter, meat, eggs, shoes, rubber and gasoline. Few civilian cars were built from 1942 to 1945 during the war.

YOLO POST 77 SALUTED IN THE HOLLINGSHEAD HISTORICAL PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBIT AT THE 2008 YOLO COUNTY FAIR

Legionnaire Bill Hollingshead displayed over 70 photographs taken by his father, Paul W. Hollingshead at a special exhibit at the Yolo County Fair. Bill said, "Dad, who passed away in 1974, was a proud lifetime American Legion member, joining in San Leandro and transferring to Yolo Post 77 when he and his wife Vera moved to Woodland."

The pre-war and World War II years on the Homefront were a huge part of Yolo County history and the American Legion was the cornerstone. Photos that drew the most attention at this summer's Yolo County Fair exhibit were Armistice Day parades, Courthouse ceremonies, the Legion Hall Movie Theatre, the huge Post 77 Hall interior and "War Dogs ... Dogs for Defense" from the Yolo County Pound. Bill Hollingshead continued, "The public was surprised that the first draftees were well before Pearl Harbor."

Bill Hollingshead explained, "In 2007 Post 77 Historian Larry Schapiro asked me to put a few of Dad's photos in the Legion newsletter. It became a feature page and this year Yolo Post 77 got a second place award for the best newsletter in California. I hope that my Dad's photos contributed to that honor."

DID YOU KNOW?

Babe Ruth served as the American Legion's national baseball director. Ruth's last public appearance was in Spencer, Iowa promoting American Legion baseball, six weeks before his death.

VINCE OLVERA IS VETERAN OF THE YEAR



The Yolo County Veterans Coalition, an organization of all the veterans' service organizations in the county, has selected American Legion Post 77 officer Vince Olvera (center) as "Veteran of the Year." The award was presented on Aug. 9th by Ted Puntillo (l.), California Deputy Secretary of Veterans Affairs and Post 77 member. Woodland City Councilman Jeff Monroe (r.), also a member of Post 77, was the main speaker at the award presentation and banquet. Vince Olvera, currently Post 77 Sergeant-at-Arms, has held many offices at Post 77, in addition to currently being an officer of the Veterans Coalition, an American Legion District 6 officer, and the veterans' representative on the Yolo County Board of Supervisor's Community Services Action Board. A Vietnam combat veteran, Vince has participated this last year in 36 Honor Guards at the funerals of Yolo County veterans, in addition to providing medical assistance to homeless and at-risk veterans and working with Boy Scout Troop 68 as the liaison of the troop sponsor, Yolo Post 77. He has also for years put up the flags on Main Street on patriotic holidays, as well as placing out flags at the Woodland Cemetery. Vince Olvera has additionally been active in many other community activities, including as a Little League umpire for over 30 years. Congratulations, Vince.

POST 77 – A PART OF THE HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

Just how soon after the formation of the American Legion in 1919 was Post 77 chartered? Answer: The American Legion was founded in Paris at the first caucus by members of the American Expeditionary Force on March 15-17, 1919. Later that same year of the formation of the American Legion, on October 11, 1919, Yolo Post 77 was issued its temporary charter. This was only months prior to Post 1, in Washington, D.C., receiving its temporary charter on May 19, 1919. Post 77 was awarded its permanent charter on October 25, 1921.

There are almost 15,000 American Legion Posts, and we are the 77th. That's a piece of history.

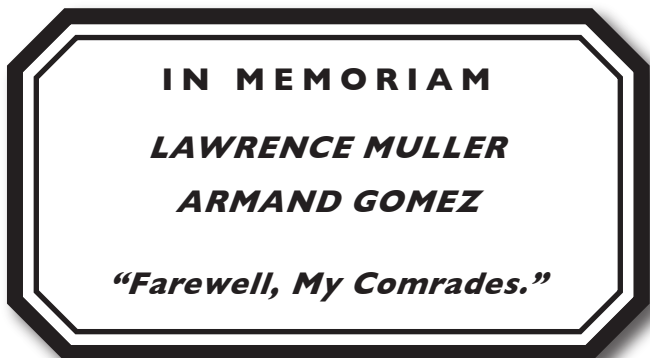
