## Constitutional Oratory Held

The U. S. Constitution appears to be in good hands with our younger generation, as indicated by high school students from throughout Northern California who participated Sunday in a constitutional oratorical contest at the Woodland City Hall Council Chambers.

Sponsored by the American Legion Area 1, students spoke on a topic of their choosing dealing with the Constitution with an emphasis upon the duties and obligations of citizens to our government.

This was followed with an extemporaneous speech by the students about the 27th Amendment.

The winner of the American Legion northern California oratorical contest is Lynette Rheault, representing Yolo County and Sacramento counties.

Her speech concluded with an impassioned plea: "If we want to keep our freedom and liberty, it is our duty as citizens of the United States to get back to the founding principles of this great Republic, to know our rights, to ensure that our Constitution is being followed, to know the limited powers of our elected officials, and to respect and remember the sacrifices of those who fought for our freedom."

Second-place winner Sarah Crowder of Antioch analogized that "Just buying the ingredients is not going to produce a cake. The Constitution has an important list of ingredients. The American people need to use the rights the Constitution has given them."

Willits High School student Davis Stansberry was concerned that we not continue to "see a similarity between a presidential campaign and choosing a prom King and Queen."

Area 1 first place winner Lynette Rheault goes on to the State American Legion contest this weekend in Ontario.

The oratory contest judges included Woodland High School teacher Mike Owens, Col. Ed Trautt (retired) of Davis, retired teacher Margaret Ross, Sacramento American Legion Post 807 Historian Susan Johnson, and teacher Greg Patterson. Area I American Legion Commander Gary Leach of Dunnigan and William Davis of Wheatland were in charge of the event, with assistance from Yolo Post 77 members.

## CRABS AND POST 77 GO HAND AND CLAW TOGETHER



The January 22nd Post 77 annual all-you-can eat crab and shrimp fest dinner has again earned enough money to cover the expenses of next season's Post 77 baseball team, plus for money that goes towards the American Legion Junior Baseball team in Davis. The Post Baseball Committee spends a thank you to all who attended. A much appreciated also goes out to the many people who helped put on the event, including the many servers at the dinner.

Post 77 crab feeds began 35 years ago. Back then, there were only four organizations in Woodland who held crab feeds. Along with Post 77, the other three were the Flyers Club, Yolo Sportmans' Club and Willow Oak Fire Department. There are many more now. In fact, when the Post held its crab feed this year, there were three other crab feeds in Woodland the same day. The Post 77 crab feed averages attendance of 500 to 600 people.

The annual Post crab feeds were initially run by World War I veteran Harvey Frazier, along with the "young guys," World War II vets Wally Frasier, Jack Richter, Joe Espigares, Ray Sanchez and Don Urain. They are all gone now. Frank Eakle, Doyle Gasperson and Steve Hedington have taken over the duties for many years now, with the help of a legion of Legion members and others.

The money earned from the annual crab feed is used to support the Post youth baseball program. Post 77 has sponsored American Legion baseball in Yolo County for over 80 years. The student players do not have to pay anything to play. Post 77 picks up the cost of uniforms, tournament fees, and the expenses of motels and food for away games, among other expenses.
